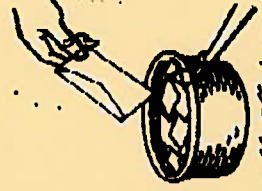

The Feast of the Divine Mercy Our Lord asked St. Faustina to pray and work towards establishing a Feast of the Divine Mercy on the Sunday after Easter. He told her. On that day, the very depths of my tender mercy are open. I pour out a whole ocean of graces upon souls who approach the fount of My mercy. The soul that will go to confession and receive Holy Communion shall obtain complete forgiveness of sins and punishment. (diary, 699)

Sunday April 11th, the Feast of the Divine Mercy is a day that celebrates the paschal mystery with a focus on God's covenant of mercy. This is a day of complete forgiveness and pardon, like the day of atonement in the Old Testament (see Lir. 16)—all our sins and the punishment due to them would be atoned for.

We can celebrate this "Mercy Sunday" by going to confession and by receiving Communion on that day. We can honour the Mercy of the Lord by our prayers and words of mercy. Sister Faustina was canonized in the year 2000 and Divine Mercy Sunday was celebrated for the first time that year.

There will be a Divine Mercy Celebration at St. Bernard's Church from 2:30pm to 3:30pm. Before that, a half hour of Private Adoration. Presided by Fr. D. Deveau. Confessions: Fr. Thibodeau.
