<http://www.diocesemoncton.ca>. **MAKING LIFE MEANINGFUL THROUGH DEATH:** How does life continue to be meaningful as we struggle to cope with the various losses in our lives- loss of jobs, the loss of marriage and as we live the month of November in the church the loss of loved ones? Sr. Eileen McQuaid, a member of the Congregation of Notre Dame, and chaplain with the palliative care and family medicine units at Moncton City Hospital will present three sessions on Tuesdays, November 15, 22 and 29 at Holy Family Church Hall to talk about the losses we experience throughout our lives. Session 1: What is Grief? What are the normal reactions and emotions which surface when we encounter loss and how do we control them? Session 2: Four Tasks of Grieving: Sometimes we become obsessive about our remembrances of the person who died, and build endless memorials. Session 3: The Spiritual Lessons of Loss: The spirituality of grief can lead to healing. These sessions will include some education, experience and ritual around the lessons we have experienced.
